Our restaurant offers gourmet cuisine of the highest standard, which can be enjoyed on our main deck while taking in the majestic views of the mighty Orange River. With game on its doorstep and rocky hills in the background, the luxury accommodation setting is nothing short of spectacular.

Lodging is in standalone riverfront rooms, all with private decks overlooking the river. All rooms are on-suite and equipped with air-con, and a select few even have their own outdoor jacuzzi. All are a short walk

from our swimming pool and we have to a variety of activities.

HUNTING

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The vegetation and topography of the land that we hunt on are diverse, and depending on the species to be hunted can vary from Karoo veld, thickets, and river vegetation, to rocky hills and shale outcrops. The hunting method is adapted to suit the area and the game that is to be hunted, where walk and stalk, ambush hunting, hunting from fully equipped Land Cruiser vehicles and hunting from blinds or our tree stand are all possible. Species available include: Eland, Impala, Red Hartebeest, Tsessebe, Gemsbok/Oryx, Roan Antelope, Sable, Blue Wildebeest, Springbok, Kudu, Mountain Reedbuck, Blesbok, Bontebok, Lechwe, Warthog and Ostrich.

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WING SHOOTING

The large stretch of the Orange River that runs through the property, salt pans, inland ponds, indigenous Karoo and river bush and the nearby irrigation fields, makes the area around the lodge a wing shooters paradise.

There is an abundance of waterfowl and during certain times of the year, the Geese flocks are massive. Birds other than waterfowl are also found in good numbers and offer a different type of challenge. The elusive Orange River Francolin is probably the most prized target species for the area. Popular species available are: Guinea Fowl, Egyptian Geese, Spur Winged Geese, Yellow Billed Duck, Red Billed Spur Fowl, Orange River Francolin and a variety of Doves and Pigeons.

FLY FISHING

The Orange River below Vanderkloof Dam is one of South Africa's best kept secrets when it comes to fly fishing for Smallmouth and Largemouth yellowfish. The spectacular Orange River is generally regarded as the yellowfish fly fisherman, and this section is arguably the best section of the river. With plenty of shallow rapids, long slow glides and big pools, the river offers everything a fly fisherman could ask for, whether it is a trophy Largemouth, a Smallmouth sipping dries in crystal clear water, or nymphing for Smallmouth in the rapids, the angler will not be disappointed.





THE MACNAB

The Macnab has its roots in the 1925 novel John Macnab, by John Buchan, and is seen as the ultimate sporting challenge that only a select few have come away with successfully.

The original challenge runs from dawn to dusk, where the participant has to first shoot a pheasant on the wing, then a buck on foot, and then use the materials harvested from the bird and the buck to tie a fly. One then has what is left of the day to catch a trout with that fly. This Scottish idea has been adapted by us to fit in with the unique birds, game, and fish we have in and around to the Orange River. This African variation offers a much more rewarding challenge.
